### Energy Conservation

TAMU has improved energy efficiency for the 10 year period from FY96 - FY05 by 25.6% based on improvement in the Campus Energy Use Index, measured in mBtu\* consumption per gross square foot. These efforts translate into a \$35.57 million cost avoidance over this period.

\*Btus are measurement of energy consumption. mBtu stands for one million Btus.

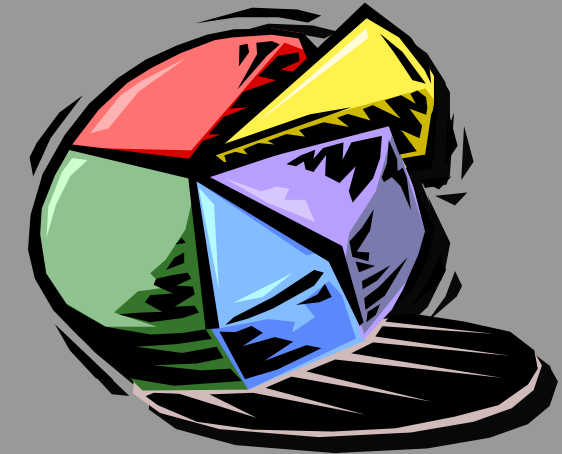
