Energy Conservation

TAMU has improved energy efficiency from FY98 - FY06 by 32.4% based on improvement in the Campus Energy Use Index, measured in mBtu* consumption per gross square foot (GSF). If energy consumption per GSF had not improved since FY98, TAMU would have paid an additional \$47.9 million for purchased utilities over the last eight years.

*Btus are measurement of energy consumption. mBtu stands for one million Btus.

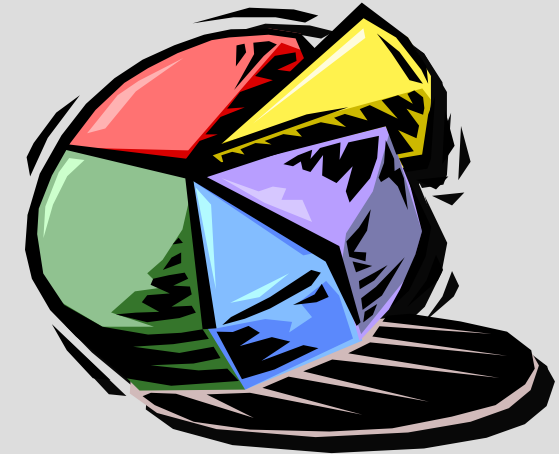
